

## Call for Papers Special Track on Mobile Platform Security and Manageability

### The 2006 International Conference on Security and Management (SAM'06) June 26 - 29, 2006, Monte Carlo Resort, Las Vegas, Nevada, USA

The SAM'06 Conference will be held simultaneously with a number of other international conferences and workshops, and will be sponsored by the World Academy of Sciences and co-sponsored by CSREA. Today's mobile users, wireless service providers, and IT organizations operate in an increasingly dynamic environment facing unprecedented challenges to reinforce network security, protect assets, increase manageability, and improve productivity. This year, SAM'06 will offer a Special Track on Mobile Platform Security and Manageability aimed at promoting discussions on industry efforts to implement manageability and security technologies on mobile and wireless platforms.

You are invited to submit a paper, which may be about 5 pages (see below for submittal information), or a panel proposal. All accepted papers will be published in the conference proceedings.

#### SUBMISSION OF PAPERS AND PANEL PROPOSALS

Prospective authors are invited to submit a draft copy of the paper (about 5 pages - single spaced, font-size of 10 to 12) to Selim Aissi @ [selim.aissi@intel.com](mailto:selim.aissi@intel.com) by the due date (see schedule below).

The length of the Camera-Ready papers (if accepted) will be limited to 7 (IEEE style) pages. Papers must not have been previously published or currently submitted for publication elsewhere. Panel proposals should be no longer than three pages in length, should include possible panelists, and should include an indication of which panelists have confirmed participation. The first page of the paper or the panel proposal should include: title and each author's name, affiliation, postal address, E-mail address, telephone number, and Fax number. The first page should also include the name of the author who will be presenting the paper and a maximum of 5 keywords.
